Owls:

This week in Owl class, we've been diving into some exciting new learning! In Science, we've been exploring the fascinating world of seed dispersal and discovering just how amazing fruits can be. To support our next lesson, we kindly ask that all Year 3 children bring a fruit to school – it will help us investigate how seeds travel and grow.

In PE, we've served up a new sport – tennis! The children had a fantastic time taking part in a carousel of fun tennis games, all designed to practise key skills such as coordination, agility, and teamwork. The energy and enthusiasm on the courts were brilliant to see!

Over in History, we've been stepping back in time to compare historical maps of our village, Ashton Hayes, from 1836 with maps from today. Using laptops, the children became young historians, spotting similarities and differences between past and present. It was a wonderful opportunity to connect with the local area and spark lots of curiosity.

Sparrowhawks:

This week in Sparrowhawks we have been learning about animals and their habitats. Whilst learning about David Attenborough's animal discoveries and subsequent naming of animals after him, we have designed our own 'not yet discovered animals' and thought about how they have adapted to their habitat.

We have been continuing to enjoy our new book- The Last Wolf- and discovered that there is a family of endangered animals living in a tree cave!!

Kestrels:

Kestrels have been very busy this week sorting both natural and man-made materials. They made beautiful spiral designs using the concrete materials. We are excited about our upcoming walk around Ashton Village and more details will follow. We read Rosie's Walk



and drew detailed maps of her journey, along with making a model of Rosie's journey in the Tuff Tray. The children were absolutely amazing at re-telling the story in great detail!

Buzzards:

After a lovely half term break, Buzzard class have had a great first week back. In writing, we have been focussing on our editing skills. We have revisited some of our earlier pieces of writing, evaluating them and re-drafting them to show off all of the writing skills we have learnt this year. In Maths, Year 5 have been exploring and measuring angles whilst Year 6 have been working on algebra - describing number patterns and sequences as algebraic expressions. Our afternoons have been filled with RE, PE, Forest School, Art and Lion King fever! In RE, we are learning about Hinduism and have started to explore how Hindu's view God. In PE, we have been working on our tennis skills. We practised bouncing the ball in a controlled manner and aiming before playing a game of 'tennis battleships'. Rehearsals for our KS2 Lion King production have begun and Year 6 have wowed us with their acting skills and how many of their lines they have learnt already! Year 5 have made a start on costume design and our giant papier mache Pumba head is taking shape.

Peregrines:

This week in Peregrine class we have started our new topics in each subject. We explored the features of mosques and who leads the sermons during R.E. We also started to research seasonal foods for our D.T. topic which focusses on designing and making our own healthy salads. During P.E. we were developing our hand to eye coordination skills through Tennis, challenging ourselves to serve the ball into a hoop accurately and consistently. Our Year 5's have been getting to grips with protractors and learning how to measure angles in Maths whilst our Year 4's have been showing off their fantastic times tables knowledge in preparation for the Multiplication Tables Check. Well done Peregrines. It's been a good first week back.

Forest School:

This week in Forest School both Owls and Peregrines have been using our engineering brains, designing, building rafts and floating them on the pond. Reception were very lucky as they have had the best weather this week, we enjoyed a story by our pond (which is slowly filling up thanks to the rain), made bubble wands and blew massive bubbles, it was so lovely. Going forward our Year 6 Leavers are taking charge of their sessions, this week Bentley and Jacob have set the bar very high, with a jam-packed session of dance off's, den building and 1,2,3 come to me, obviously with S'mores \bigcirc . Sparrowhawks are exploring the ladybird pupa that they have found on the trees today.
