# COMMUNICATION AND PUNCTUALITY

We are continually reviewing our communication and partnership between school and parents. The start of the school day is a very busy time for teachers who are eager to get the children into school and begin their lessons. This does not mean that teachers are unavailable to speak to; they are happy to receive small messages whilst welcoming your children into class. We would simply ask that if you would like a longer discussion with your child's class teacher, or anyone else in school, that you contact the school office, by phone, email or in person. A message will be passed to them requesting a telephone call back or a face-to-face meeting. Please bear in mind that teachers are class-based and often have meetings or extra-curricular activities during lunchtime and after school, therefore they will endeavour to return your call within a maximum of two school-working days.

Ashton Hayes is committed to the well-being of all members of its staff. Therefore, we do not release individual email addresses of teachers in order to ensure emails are not received out of working hours. If an email / longer message needs to be given to the class teacher, please email the school office, admin@ashtonhayes.cheshire.sch.uk, and the message will be given to the class teacher at the earliest convenience.

All school trips, sporting events and club bookings (school clubs, not private providers) are completed on the ParentPay platform — we will endeavour to send a text message to direct you to this information.

Please remember that school starts at 8.45am. Doors open at 8.40am and the children come straight in to class to complete a morning challenge. Mathematical lessons begin in 17-16 from 19am so we would ask you to ensure that your child is on time, so that no learning is missed.
