
Mini Art Project

This week, I want us to get arty!! First of all, I want you to have a bit of a research of some famous (or not so famous) artists. Who catches your eye? Which artwork excites you? Who interests you the most? Once you have chosen your artist, complete the following tasks in order. This work should last you over the next 3 days so spread it out however you like!

Task 1: Create a mood board of the work of your chosen artist. You may do this in a number of ways. I would suggest you use a collage technique. If you have a printer, you may want to print some little examples of their work, maybe some important facts about them, you might want to collage on some general colours that they use in their work, some images that remind you of their work. You could also complete this task using your own drawings if you do not have a printer, or you could create a layered collage on the computer. Whatever way you create it, your mood board should feel like THEM. Here are some examples:







Task 2: Research, research, research!!!! Learn everything you can about your artist. Where they came from, their hobbies, their artwork, everything!! REMEMBER: When you are researching, the world wide web can be a HUGE place filled with lots of sometimes confusing and inappropriate or irrelevant information, so type in kiddle to google and use that top link as your search engine!! It will make sure you only get the best bits that you need!

So, make notes and get ready for task 3...

Task 3: Write a biography on your chosen artist! Remember, you wrote a biography last week so you this should be a doddle! There were lots of useful tips last week (Tuesday 12 May) if you want to use the work on that blog to help you.

Task 4: Create your own piece of artwork inspired by the work of your chosen artist. Obviously I do not know who your chosen artist is, so I can't suggest whether to use paint, or pencils, or maybe it's a 3D model maker! Who knows! Just know that I am VERY excited to see them.

Task 5: Imagine that your artwork is being put up on display in an art gallery, write a paragraph for the plaque that would go next to it. Remember to include the title of your artwork, the artist's name (yours), the date of publication, what the artwork is showing, the inspiration behind the artwork and any other information you would like to include.
